LOS ANGELES (May 22, 2013) – Grand Park today announced a robust, multi-dimensional series of free summer events and activities designed to help Angelenos make this a summer to remember. For the first complete summer season since the park's October 2012 grand opening, Grand Park will feature a wide variety of exciting opportunities for park visitors, including music from both live bands and DJs; a ballet performance under the stars; a movies-in-the park series; a speakers series; and a number of participatory events, including a movie dance-along, group drumming experiences, a boot camp and special activities for families and kids. The park will also host two major public summer celebrations in July, including a July 4th block party and National Dance Day festivities.

According to Grand Park Director Lucas Rivera, the diversity of the community and the way people have embraced the park were driving forces in the development of the park's summer programming line-up. "While not yet a year old, Grand Park already has a special welcoming and engaging spirit, which comes from our visitors, whether they are reading a book under a tree, splashing in the fountain or enjoying a nighttime concert," Rivera explained. "We will celebrate the enthusiasm they have for Grand Park by offering new ways for park visitors to appreciate its beauty and versatility as a setting for many different types of experiences."

Grand Park's Out-of-Office

Downtowners can get an early start to the weekend on Thursdays and enjoy warm summer twilight hours after a day in the office. This free concert series will feature LA-based artists and tastemakers from a broad spectrum of genres from jazz, to indie, to pops, to name a few.
