GRAND PARK'S OUR L.A. VOICES: SPRING ARTS FESTIVAL TO CELEBRATE L.A.'S VIBRANT ARTS COMMUNITY DURING WEEKEND-LONG EXHIBITION

 Free Three-Day Visual and Performing Arts Event to Showcase Local Artists and Provide a Stage for Artistic Expression and Connection with Local Audiences –

LOS ANGELES (March 29, 2018) – Grand Park will celebrate L.A. artists from April 27-29 at the first annual *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival*, a public arts exhibition that will gather diverse and powerful talent from around Los Angeles County and showcase the region's artistic excellence. A tent-pole event that will spotlight Grand Park's ongoing commitment to L.A.'s creative communities, *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival* will be a free "best of L.A." performing and visual arts event representing the County's many voices and perspectives. The weekend-long celebration will feature outdoor theatrical and dance performances, storytelling, youth performances, live art and a public marketplace with nearly 30 artists creating and/or selling their work on-site.

With family-friendly programming, *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival* will create an opportunity for Angelenos to experience the diverse richness of the County's arts community. Highlights from the festival line-up include The Fountain Theatre's production of *Citizen*, a provocative meditation on race that fuses prose, poetry, movement, music and visual images; Antics Dance Theatre's *Sneaker Suites*, featuring dancers, live spoken word poetry and short films; Grand Park's PROUD Stories, a series of spoken word and storytelling performances from the LGBTQ community; and the Jardin deLArte 2018, a public marketplace showcasing L.A.-based visual artists and crafts people in partnership with Self Help Graphics and DTLA Proud; and two stages featuring DJs and local artists including Garth Trinidad, DJ Tendaji Lathan and Shiva.

"Los Angeles is home to a powerful, diverse arts scene with boundless creativity," said Rachel Moore, president and CEO of The Music Center. "Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival will create a home for these artists and provide a beautiful setting for them to perform and display their work while connecting with new audiences," Moore continued.

"Throughout Grand Park's five-year history, we have been committed to supporting L.A.'s arts community and have helped develop many emerging talented artists," said Julia Diamond, interim director, Grand Park. "By creating, nurturing and sharing art, Grand Park has become a home for artists and a place where art lovers can find common ground and uncover the themes that unite us as Angelenos. We are proud to provide the stage for creativity and expression with *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival* and look forward to this festival becoming an annual Grand Park tradition."

With the inaugural theme of "What does it mean to be a citizen?", Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival line-up will probe issues of belonging and alienation as well cultural equity and inclusion. The Fountain Theatre's production of Citizen by Claudia Rankine and adapted by Stephen Sachs will focus on acts of everyday racism through a lyric poem, snapshots and vignettes. Antics' Dance Theatre's Sneaker Suites, a collaboration with story architect Mark Gonzales, will use the virtuosity and hyper-physicality of street dance vocabulary to delve into the diverse and personal relationships that many people have with sneakers, an emblem of street culture and one of the most highly-purchased fashion items and means of self-expression in the world. Grand Park's PROUD Stories will continue its tradition of presenting narratives about how Los Angeles connects people no matter who they are or whom they love. The festival's Jardin delArte will offer a gathering spot for artists to create and sell paintings, prints, jewelry and other works. In addition, the festival will include youth performances by the Pomona Youth Orchestra, Little Kids Rock, and Jose Hernandez Mariachi Heritage Society, pop-up performances and many other opportunities to experience the arts throughout the park.

A partner with the **Department of Cultural Affairs' the Big Read,** *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices: Spring Arts Festival* dovetails with this year's literacy program book selection -- Claudia Rankine's "Citizen: An American Lyric."
