GRAND PARK'S SPRING PROGRAMMING CELEBRATES L.A.'S DIVERSE CULTURE AND WELCOMES THE RETURN OF GRAND PARK'S OUR L.A. VOICES - L.A. ARTS FESTIVAL

-Springtime Events Feature Community-Minded Programs and the Park's Signature Experiences Including Earth Day LA, Grand Park's Lunch à la Park Concerts, Food Trucks, and Yoga reTREAT-

LOS ANGELES (January 15, 2019) – The Music Center today announced Grand Park's free spring programming line-up, which features some of the park's signature events along with the return of *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices - L.A. Arts Festival*, a week-long arts gathering that focuses exclusively on the diverse and powerful artistic talent in Los Angeles County. The park's spring season also includes the fifth annual *Earth Day L.A.*, which offers Angelenos ideas on how to live clean and go green, and *Grand Park's Lunch à la Park* programs, featuring spring concerts by L.A.'s youth artists, food trucks and yoga throughout the spring months.

"Grand Park's spring programming is quintessentially L.A., showcasing the boundless creativity of the county's visionary artists while continuing to offer the experiences that Angelenos enjoy in Grand Park year after year," said Rachel Moore, president and CEO of The Music Center. "The park is the perfect gathering place to celebrate L.A.'s vibrant cultural scene, connect with our dynamic artistic community and engage with each other through shared thought-provoking experiences."

Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices - L.A. Arts Festival is a free, three-day performing and visual arts showcase that transforms Grand Park into a home for L.A.'s creative communities. The festival features dance, music and theatre performances, as well as visual artwork, all by L.A.-based artists. Designed to highlight and encompass the best of L.A.'s artist community, Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices - L.A. Arts Festival runs Saturday, April 27, 2019 and Sunday, April 28, 2019 with free lunchtime workshops the week leading up to the festival. The workshops will focus on creative practice, as well as the pragmatic side of making art in Los Angeles. While open to all, the workshops require pre-registration.

"The spring season is a time of renewal, and Grand Park is the perfect place to shed the winter blues and celebrate our county's unrivaled creative community," said Julia Diamond, Grand Park's interim director. "Whether it's Grand Park's annual *Our L.A. Voices* festival, a lunchtime concert by one of the area's many talented youth ensembles, or a noontime yoga session, Grand Park offers Angelenos a myriad of ways to refresh and reconnect during this time of rejuvenation and discovery.

Grand Park's Lunch à la Park Spring Concerts featuring L.A.'s Youth Artists

Thursdays, April – May 31, 2018; 12:15 p.m. -- 1:15 p.m.

These weekly lunchtime concerts feature artists from L.A.'s top conservatories and training programs for high school artists. The series includes students from L.A. County High School for the Arts, California School for the Arts – San Gabriel Valley, and *The Music Center's Spotlight* Program.

Grand Park's Our LA Voices - L.A. Arts Festival

Saturday, April 27, 2019 and Sunday, April 28, 2019; 11:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Grand Park's week-long spring arts experience, *Grand Park's Our L.A. Voices – L.A. Arts Festival*, is a regional arts gathering that focuses exclusively on the diverse and powerful artistic talent in Los Angeles County. Envisioned as an annual "best of L.A. arts festival," this free, two-day performing and visual arts showcase will bring dance, music and theatre performances, as well as visual artwork by L.A. artists to Grand Park. The festival's 2019 theme, *Origin Stories*, explores and showcases distinctly Los Angeles narratives and questions about where we are, how we got here and where we are going.

Monday, April 22, 2019 - Friday, April 26, 2019

As part of *Grand Park's Our LA Voices – L.A. Arts Festival*, Grand Park will offer free workshops on creative practice, as well as the pragmatic side of making art in L.A. Topics range from street dance activism and acting, to intellectual property and copyright protection, marketing, entrepreneurship skills and fundraising. These workshops are open to all and require pre-registration.

Lunch trucks on Olive Court (between Grand Avenue and Hill Street) & the Marketplace (between Spring Street and Broadway)

With more than 50,000 lunches sold in the park just last year, Grand Park continues its tradition of lunchtime in the park by providing downtowners and visitors a wide variety of food trucks three days per week. Trucks are parked in two locations in the park: on Olive Court, between Grand Avenue and Hill Street (adjacent to the L.A. County Hall of Administration), and in the Marketplace (adjacent to City Hall), between Broadway and Spring Street.

Grand Park's popular yoga sessions continue, giving participants the opportunity to relax, rejuvenate and re-energize. All levels are welcome. Mats are provided.

Thursday, April 11, 2019, 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Grand Park joins The Music Center and the Los Angeles Department of Water & Power to celebrate Earth Day and offer Downtown L.A.'s residents, workers and visitors ideas and solutions on how to live clean and go green. The annual event features performances, children's recycle art project, e-waste collection, drought tolerant plant tours, plant giveaways and demonstrations of the latest in green technology, which are all free to the public (and to a select number of school groups).
